The journal seeks to continually increase its distribution and recognition. The journal is distributed to a large number of orthopaedic surgeons and University of Pennsylvania alumni. In addition, it is sent to all orthopaedic departments in the country. *UPOJ* is also accessible through the Internet at http://www.med.upenn.edu/ortho/oj/. In the near future, we hope to apply for reference in *Index Medicus*. We are proud of our journal and we are continuously striving to improve.

In closing, the editors would like to thank authors, reviewers, and the editorial staff. The production of the *University of Pennsylvania Orthopaedic Journal* is the result of the tireless devotion of the residents.
