
The Leo Leung Lecture

ROBERT N. HOTCHKISS, M.D.

2003 marked the inauguration of the Leo Leung Endowed Lectureship. The lecture was founded in the memory of Dr. Leung, a resident in the department of orthopaedic surgery who passed away suddenly in April 2002. The endowment was funded solely from donations made from faculty and friends of Leo.

Dr. Leung was a model resident who exhibited all the qualities desired of a compassionate physician, dedicated educator, and loyal friend. Dr. Leung served as editor of the University of Pennsylvania Orthopaedic Journal in 2001-2002 and was voted by his co-residents to serve as academic chief of the residency in 2002-2003 before his untimely passing. He hoped to pursue a career in hand surgery and was actively recruited by the top hand surgery fellowships in the country. His passing was an immense loss to the department and all who knew him. In deciding on a speaker for the inaugural lecture, it was only appropriate to invite one of the most prominent hand surgeons in the country, Robert Hotchkiss, M.D.
